

TJCSGA JUDICIAL POLICY

The following behaviors are prohibited during the TJCSGA State Convention. Students or schools who violate this policy will be reported to the Judicial Committee for review:

1. Plagiarism or furnishing false information to the TJCSGA with intent to deceive.
2. Forgery, alteration, unauthorized possession, or misuse of TJCSGA documents or records.
3. Malicious destruction, damage, unauthorized possession, or misuse of TJCSGA property, or of private property of the hotel during the convention.
4. Possession, attempted possession, consumption, or transmittal of alcoholic beverages or illegal drugs.
5. Conduct that inhibits or interferes with the responsibility of the TJCSGA or a member or disrupts the administrative or service functions of the TJCSGA.
6. Violation of the terms of discipline or the infraction of any TJCSGA, college, or hotel rules or campaign violations.
7. Violation of any criminal statute or code while engaging in any TJCSGA activity.
8. Discrimination against persons based upon race, color, sex, pregnancy, religion, creed, national origin (including ancestry), citizenship status, physical or mental disability, age, marital status, sexual orientation, gender, transgender status, gender identity, gender expression, veteran or military status (including special disabled veteran, Vietnam-era veteran, or recently separated veteran), predisposing genetic characteristic, domestic violence victim status, any other protected category under applicable local, state, or federal law, or persons who have opposed discrimination or participated in any complaint process on campus or before a government agency.
